WHAT IS BULLYING?

Lower Moreland School District takes any accusation of bullying very seriously. In fact, there is an entire section devoted to bullying in the School Board policy. Bullying is defined in School Board Policy 249-Bullying/Cyberbullying as follows:

"A person is bullied when he or she is exposed, repeatedly and over time to negative actions on the part of one or more other persons, and he or she has difficulty defending himself or herself" (Oweus Bullying Prevention Program). Bullying is aggressive behavior that involves unwanted negative actions. Bullying involves a pattern of behavior repeated over time. Bullying involves an imbalance of power or strength. Bullying as defined in this policy involves cyberbullying."

WHAT IS THE PA SAFE2SAY SOMETHING PROGRAM?


There are many programs in the Lower Moreland Township School District and community that are designed to help stop and prevent all forms of bullying. One program in particular is called the Safe2Say Something program.

The Safe2Say Something program is run by the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General. It teaches you what signs to recognize if someone is a threat to themselves or others, and how to help before it's too late.
